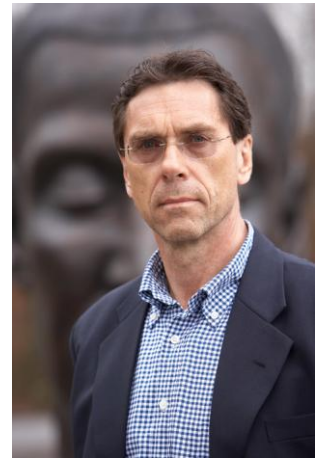

Prof. Dr. Marie-Theres Albert

Prof. Dr. Marie-Theres Albert has been a teacher in higher education and the director of the Chair for Intercultural Studies at Brandenburg University of Technology in Cottbus since 1994.

She has been the Chair holder of a UNITWIN UNESCO Chair in Heritage Studies since October 2003. Additionally, she is an education researcher and has been involved in numerous consultancy and research projects, several of which included stays in countries in Latin America and Asia. She is also the founder and director of the Master's and PhD Programmes in Heritage Studies.



University Prof. Dr. Kurt Luger

Kurt Luger is a professor in Transcultural Communication in the Communication Science Faculty at the University of Salzburg and holds the UNESCO-Chair “Cultural Heritage and Tourism”. His main areas of experience are in globalization and international media development, world-wide tourism and development policy.

He studied Communication Science, Philosophy and Political Economy in Munich and Salzburg.

He took up his current post at Salzburg University in 1980. He has also been a guest professor at the Pepperdine University in Malibu (USA), at the Tribhuvan University in Kathmandu (Nepal) and, more recently, has been employed at the Institute for Journalism and Media Research at the University of Zurich.

He is also research director of the “Intercultural Competences” and “Master in Intercultural Studies” courses at the University of Salzburg. Since 1995 Kurt Luger has been chairman of the Society for the Alpine-Himalaya-Eco Himal Cooperation, and, as such, is responsible for regional development projects in Nepal, Tibet and Pakistan.

Prof. Dr. Karl H. Müller

Karl H. Müller was Director of the Institute of Political Science and Sociology at the Institute for Advanced Studies in Vienna from 1997 until 2001. He is currently director of WISDOM – Austria's infrastructure centre for Social Sciences, and also coordinator of a new research programme at the University of Ljubljana known as RISC (Rare Incidents, Strong Consequences). He is also President of the Heinz von Foerster Company.

His main research interests are: complex model building within the social sciences, interdisciplinary analysis of innovation processes in Science, Technology, Economics and History, current potentials in inter- and trans-disciplinary research, advances in the science of cybernetics and latest developments in radical constructivism and risk dynamics in present-day society.
